

## OFFICE OF THE CHIEF - Criminal Enforcement - 2012 Annual Report Addendum


There was a 1.8% decrease in Part I Crimes within the City of Gaithersburg for January – December of 2012, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January – December of 2011.

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was a decrease as compared to 2011 in murder, rapes, larcenies and auto thefts.

In 2012 burglaries saw a 2.6% increase, from 193 incidents in 2011 to 198 incidents in 2012. Residential burglaries decreased by 3.3% from 152 in 2011 to 147 in 2012. Commercial burglaries increased by 24.4% from 41 in 2011 to 51 in 2012.

Robberies saw a 42.6% increase from 54 incidents in 2011 to 77 incidents in 2012. Street robberies saw a 45.7% increase from 35 in 2011 to 51 in 2012 and commercial robberies saw a 160.0% increase from 5 in 2011 to 13 in 2012.

There was a 6.2% decrease in larcenies, from 1,367 incidents in 2011 to 1,282 incidents in 2012. Theft from vehicles/theft of vehicle parts decreased by 24.6% from 391 in 2011 to 295 in 2012. Shoplifting decreased by 2.0% from 555 in 2011 to 544 in 2012.

The original percentages quoted in the Annual Report and Addendum were the percent change in Part I and Part II Crimes combined, not just Part I Crimes (See Crime Analysis Report 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2012 and Crime Analysis Report 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2012 on the City’s website under Police - Crime Analysis Reports). Both documents have been changed to reflect the correct increase/decrease in Part I crimes only.
