Crime Analysis Report 1st Quarter 2010

There has been a **9.8% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the first quarter of 2010, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the first quarter of 2009:

Part I Crime decreased by 12.5%	(from 553 to 484)
Part II Crime decreased by 8.1%	(from 913 to 839)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) decreased by 9.8%	

Homicide:	100.0% decrease	(from 1 to 0)
Rape:	62.5% decrease	(from 8 to 3)
Robbery:	14.3% decrease	(from 21 to 18)
Aggravated Assault:	11.8% increase	(from 17 to 19)
Burglary:	13.6% increase	(from 44 to 50)
Larceny:	13.9% decrease	(from 431 to 371)
Auto Theft:	25.8% decrease	(from 31 to 23)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2009) in aggravated assaults and burglaries. There was a decrease in homicides, rapes, robberies, larcenies and auto thefts.

An analysis of the data between the 4th quarter of 2009 and the first quarter of 2010 shows an overall **decrease in crime of 9.9%**. Part I Offenses decreased by **22.1%** (from 621 to 484), and Part II Offenses decreased by **1.1%** (from 848 to 839).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.
