Crime Analysis Report 2nd Quarter 2010

There has been a **15.9% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the second quarter of 2010, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the second quarter of 2009:

Part I Crime decreased by 22.1%	(from 614 to 478)
Part II Crime decreased by 12.6%	(from 1,130 to 988)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) decreased by 15.9%	

Homicide:	No change	(from 0 to 0)
Rape:	No change	(from 2 to 2)
Robbery:	8.3% increase	(from 12 to 13)
Aggravated Assault:	22.2% decrease	(from 18 to 14)
Burglary:	7.0% increase	(from 43 to 46)
Larceny:	24.4% decrease	(from 509 to 385)
Auto Theft:	40.0% decrease	(from 30 to 18)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2009) in robberies and burglaries. There was a decrease in aggravated assaults, larcenies and auto thefts.

An analysis of the data between the first quarter of 2010 and the second quarter of 2010 shows an overall **increase in crime of 10.8%**. Part I Offenses decreased by 1.2% (from 484 to 478) with only larcenies showing an increase of 3.8% (from 371 to 385). Part II Offenses increased by 17.8% (from 839 to 988).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been a **13.1% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-June of 2010, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January-June of 2009:

Part I Crime **decreased by 17.6%** (from 1,167 to 962)
Part II Crime **decreased by 10.6%** (from 2,043 to 1,827)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 13.1%**

Homicide:	100.0% decrease	(from 1 to 0)
Rape:	50.0% decrease	(from 10 to 5)
Robbery:	6.1% decrease	(from 33 to 31)
Aggravated Assault:	5.7% decrease	(from 35 to 33)
Burglary:	10.3% increase	(from 87 to 96)
Larceny:	19.6% decrease	(from 940 to 756)
Auto Theft:	32.8% decrease	(from 61 to 41)
