Crime Analysis Report 3rd Quarter 2010

There has been a **12.7% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the third quarter of 2010, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the third quarter of 2009:

Part I Crime decreased by 26.6%	(from 643 to 472)
Part II Crime decreased by 4.3%	(from 1,068 to 1,022)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) decreased by 12.7%	

Homicide:	Not calculable	(from 0 to 1)
Rape:	25.0% increase	(from 4 to 5)
Robbery:	40.0% decrease	(from 25 to 15)
Aggravated Assault:	24.1% decrease	(from 29 to 22)
Burglary:	14.0% increase	(from 43 to 49)
Larceny:	30.0% decrease	(from 514 to 360)
Auto Theft:	28.6% decrease	(from 28 to 20)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2009) in rapes and burglaries. There was a decrease in robberies, aggravated assaults, larcenies and auto thefts.

An analysis of the data between the second quarter of 2010 and the third quarter of 2010 shows an overall **increase in crime of 1.9%**. Part I Offenses decreased by 1.3% (from 478 to 472) with the following categories showing increases - homicide (from 0 to 1), 150.0% increase in rapes (from 2 to 5), 15.4% increase in robberies (from 13 to 15), 57.1% increase in aggravated assaults (from 14 to 22), 6.5% increase in burglaries (from 46 to 49) and 11.1% increase in auto thefts (from 18 to 20). Part II Offenses increased by 3.4% (from 988 to 1,022).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been a **13.0% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-September of 2010, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January-September of 2009:

Part I Crime	decreased by 20.8%	(from 1,810 to 1,434)
Part II Crime	decreased by 8.4%	(from 3,111 to 2,849)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals)	decreased by 13.0%	
Murder:	No change	(from 1 to 1)
Rape:	28.6% decrease	(from 14 to 10)
Robbery:	20.7% decrease	(from 58 to 46)
Aggravated Assault:	14.1% decrease	(from 64 to 55)
Burglary:	11.5% increase	(from 130 to 145)
Larceny:	23.2% decrease	(from 1,454 to 1,116)
Auto Theft:	31.5% decrease	(from 89 to 61)
