Crime Analysis Report 1st Quarter 2013

There has been a **5.0% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the first quarter of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the first quarter of 2012:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 13.7%** (from 431 to 372)
- Part II Crime **decreased by 0.7%** (from 862 to 856)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 5.0%**

Homicide:	No change	(from 0 to 0)
Rape:	50.0% increase	(from 2 to 3)
Robbery:	8.7% decrease	(from 23 to 21)
Aggravated Assault:	11.8% decrease	(from 17 to 15)
Burglary:	30.9% decrease	(from 55 to 38)
Larceny:	14.7% decrease	(from 326 to 278)
Auto Theft:	112.5% increase	(from 8 to 17)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2012) in rapes and auto thefts. There was a decrease in robberies, aggravated assaults, burglaries and larcenies.

An analysis of the data between the fourth quarter of 2012 and the first quarter of 2013 shows an overall **decrease in crime of 1.0%**. Part I Offenses decreased by **3.4%** (from 385 to 372), and Part II Offenses increased by **0.1%** (from 855 to 856).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.
