



# GAITHERSBURG POLICE DEPARTMENT

## Crime Analysis Report 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2013

There has been an **8.9% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the second quarter of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the second quarter of 2012:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 8.6%** (from 441 to 403)
- Part II Crime **decreased by 9.1%** (from 983 to 894)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 8.9%**

Homicide:	No change	(from 0 to 0)
Rape:	100.0% increase	(from 3 to 6)
Robbery:	50.0% decrease	(from 24 to 12)
Aggravated Assault:	17.9% decrease	(from 28 to 23)
Burglary:	23.1% decrease	(from 52 to 40)
Larceny:	2.8% decrease	(from 316 to 307)
Auto Theft:	16.7% decrease	(from 18 to 15)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2012) in rapes. There was a decrease in robberies, aggravated assaults, burglaries, larcenies and auto thefts.

An analysis of the data between the first quarter of 2013 and the second quarter of 2013 shows an overall **increase in crime of 5.6%**. Part I Offenses increased by 8.3% (from 372 to 403) with the following categories showing increases - rapes up 100.0% (from 3 to 6), aggravated assaults up 53.3% (from 15 to 23), burglaries up 5.3% (from 38 to 40) and larcenies up 10.4% (from 278 to 307). Part II Offenses increased by 4.4% (from 856 to 894).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

**Cumulative Year to Date**

There has been a **7.1% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-June of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January-June of 2012:

- Part I Crime **decreased** by **11.1%** (from 872 to 775)
- Part II Crime **decreased** by **5.1%** (from 1,845 to 1,750)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 7.1%**

Rape:	80.0% increase	(from 5 to 9)
Robbery:	29.8% decrease	(from 47 to 33)
Aggravated Assault:	15.6% decrease	(from 45 to 38)
Burglary:	27.1% decrease	(from 107 to 78)
Larceny:	8.9% decrease	(from 642 to 585)
Auto Theft:	23.1% increase	(from 26 to 32)
