Crime Analysis Report 3rd Quarter 2013

There has been an **18.6% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the third quarter of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the third quarter of 2012:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 4.5%** (from 471 to 450)
- Part II Crime **decreased by 24.3%** (from 1,163 to 880)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 18.6%**

Homicide:	No change	(from 0 to 0)
Rape:	75.0% decrease	(from 4 to 1)
Robbery:	6.3% increase	(from 16 to 17)
Aggravated Assault:	12.1% decrease	(from 33 to 29)
Burglary:	No change	(from 55 to 55)
Larceny:	4.1% decrease	(from 340 to 326)
Auto Theft:	4.3% decrease	(from 23 to 22)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2012) in robberies. There was a decrease in rapes, aggravated assaults, larcenies and auto thefts.

An analysis of the data between the second quarter of 2013 and the third quarter of 2013 shows an overall **increase in crime of 2.5%**. Part I Offenses increased by 11.7% (from 403 to 450) with the following categories showing increases – 41.7% increase in robberies (from 12 to 17), 26.1% increase in aggravated assaults (from 23 to 29), 37.5% increase in burglaries (from 40 to 55), 6.2% increase in larcenies (from 307 to 326) and 46.7% increase in auto thefts (from 15 to 22). Part II Offenses decreased by 1.6% (from 894 to 880).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been an **11.4% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-September of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January-September of 2012:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 8.8%** (from 1,343 to 1,225)
- Part II Crime **decreased by 12.6%** (from 3,008 to 2,630)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 11.4%**

Murder:	No change	(from 0 to 0)
Rape:	11.1% increase	(from 9 to 10)
Robbery:	20.6% decrease	(from 63 to 50)
Aggravated Assault:	14.1% decrease	(from 78 to 67)
Burglary:	17.9% decrease	(from 162 to 133)
Larceny:	7.2% decrease	(from 982 to 911)
Auto Theft:	10.2% increase	(from 49 to 54)
