Crime Analysis Report 4th Quarter 2013

There has been a **17.4% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the fourth quarter of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the fourth quarter of 2012:

- Part I Crime **increased** by **3.1%** (from 385 to 397)
- Part II Crime **decreased** by **26.7%** (from 855 to 627)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased** by **17.4%**

Murder:	No change	(from 1 to 1)
Rape:	Not calculable	(from 0 to 2)
Robbery:	42.9% decrease	(from 14 to 8)
Aggravated Assault:	42.1% increase	(from 19 to 27)
Burglary:	63.9% increase	(from 36 to 59)
Larceny:	6.3% decrease	(from 300 to 281)
Auto Theft:	26.7% increase	(from 15 to 19)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2012) in rapes, aggravated assaults, burglaries and auto thefts. There was a decrease in robberies and larcenies.

An analysis of the data between the third and fourth quarter of 2013 shows an overall **decrease in crime of 23.0%**. Part I Offenses decreased by 11.8% (from 450 to 397) with the following categories showing an increase - murder (from 0 to 1), rapes (from 1 to 2) and burglaries (from 55 to 59). Part II Offenses decreased by 28.8% (from 880 to 627).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been a **12.7% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-December of 2013, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January-December of 2012:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 6.1%** (from 1,728 to 1,622)
- Part II Crime **decreased by 15.7%** (from 3,863 to 3,257)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 12.7%**

Murder:	No change	(from 1 to 1)
Rape:	33.3% increase	(from 9 to 12)
Robbery:	24.7% decrease	(from 77 to 58)
Aggravated Assault:	3.1% decrease	(from 97 to 94)
Burglary:	3.0% decrease	(from 198 to 192)
Larceny:	7.0% decrease	(from 1,282 to 1,192)
Auto Theft:	14.1% increase	(from 64 to 73)
