Crime Analysis Report 2nd Quarter 2015

For Release: 08/14/2015

There has been a **13.6% increase** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the second quarter of 2015¹, as compared to the statistics for the second quarter of 2014¹:

- Part I Crime **increased by 10.9%** (from 405 to 449)
- Part II Crime **increased by 16.0%** (from 475 to 551)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **increased by 13.6%**

Homicide:	100.0% decrease	(from 1 to 0)
Rape:	300.0% increase	(from 1 to 4)
Robbery:	125.0% increase	(from 8 to 18)
Aggravated Assault:	29.6% increase	(from 27 to 35)
Burglary:	38.1% increase	(from 21 to 29)
Larceny:	4.2% increase	(from 334 to 348)
Auto Theft:	15.4% increase	(from 13 to 15)

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been a **10.2% increase** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-June of 2015¹, as compared to the statistics for January-June of 2014¹:

- Part I Crime **increased by 9.1%** (from 744 to 812)
- Part II Crime **increased by 11.1%** (from 908 to 1,009)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **increased by 10.2%**

Homicide:	100.0% decrease	(from 1 to 0)
Rape:	300.0% increase	(from 3 to 12)
Robbery:	92.9% increase	(from 14 to 27)
Aggravated Assault:	71.1% increase	(from 45 to 77)
Burglary:	50.0% increase	(from 48 to 72)
Larceny:	1.2% decrease	(from 607 to 600)
Auto Theft:	7.7% decrease	(from 26 to 24)

² Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.
