Crime Analysis Report 2nd Quarter 2016

For Release: 07/26/2016

There has been a **6.4% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the second quarter of 2016¹, as compared to the statistics for the second quarter of 2015¹:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 9.4%** (from 435 to 394)
- Part II Crime **decreased by 3.9%** (from 512 to 492)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **decreased by 6.4%**

Homicide:	100.0% increase	(from 1 to 2)
Rape:	100.0% increase	(from 3 to 6)
Robbery:	47.1% decrease	(from 17 to 9)
Aggravated Assault:	37.5% decrease	(from 24 to 15)
Burglary:	No change	(from 28 to 28)
Larceny:	6.6% decrease	(from 348 to 325)
Auto Theft:	35.7% decrease	(from 14 to 9)

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been a **0.3% increase** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-June of 2016¹, as compared to the statistics for January-June of 2015¹:

- Part I Crime **decreased by 2.3%** (from 785 to 767)
- Part II Crime **increased by 2.4%** (from 968 to 991)
- Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) **increased by 0.3%**

Homicide:	100.0% increase	(from 1 to 2)
Rape:	40.0% increase	(from 10 to 14)
Robbery:	19.2% decrease	(from 26 to 21)
Aggravated Assault:	53.6% decrease	(from 56 to 26)
Burglary:	23.9% decrease	(from 71 to 54)
Larceny:	5.9% increase	(from 598 to 633)
Auto Theft:	26.1% decrease	(from 23 to 17)

² Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.
